


From our Executive Director:

From our Woods Camp Summer Speaker

This summer we taught the campers about relentless pursuit. Not only God's relentless pursuit of us, but how we should relentlessly pursue Him back. We explained how God knows everything about us, even our worst sin, and still chooses to relentlessly pursue us because He loves us that much. We showed how each and everyone of us matter to God and are loved by God through the Parable of the Lost Sheep. We then moved into dissecting the Parable of the Prodigal Son, and how both of sons were lost but in different ways. We moved on to the best part of the week: the Gospel! We shared how Jesus dying on the cross for our sins was not only the greatest act of love ever done, but how it is also an open invitation to pursue God back. After that, we talked about how to practically pursue God back in four easy steps once we accept Jesus as our Lord and Savior. Step 1: Having a personal relationship with God. We do that by communicating to Him through prayer and Him communicating to us through the Word. Step 2: Putting love at the center of that relationship. Step 3: Putting Him at the center of our lives, not just a few hours a week at church. Step 4: Repenting after we sin. We started wrapping the week up by showing how the Great Commission is not an option but a command. We also stressed that everyone needs the Gospel. There are no throwaway people to God, so there should be no throwaway people to us! We ended the week by explaining how relentlessly pursuing God is not always easy, but it will always be worth it if we cling tight to Him.

Kansas Bible Camp was conducted the week of July 24-28, 2023 at the Westminster Woods Camp in Fall River, Kansas. Two camps were simultaneously ran for youth who had completed grades 3-5 (Kids' Camp) and Middle School.
